## The May weekend 2023

#### Summer Programme

#### Tuesday 21 June 2022 — Michelham Priory

Michelham Priory is set on a picturesque island surrounded by England's longest medieval moat. The priory was founded by Augustinian canons in 1229, later becoming a country house for farming families, it housed evacuees from London and the Canadian Army during WWII. The house includes an interactive Victorian kitchen, a WWII evacuee's bedroom, Tudor kitchen, Prior's room and Undercroft. In its 7 acres of grounds are cloisters, kitchen and physic gardens, a historic watermill, a forge, an Elizabethan great barn, a dovecote and a replica Bronze Age roundhouse.

The house is owned by the Sussex Archaeological Society which is celebrating its 175th anniversary this year. A café is available.

The coach will leave Shotfield, Wallington at 10am and Ruskin Road, Carshalton at 10:15am, returning about 6 pm. The cost is £35 per person which includes coach, entrance and tour of the house.

### Thursday 28 July 2022 — Lewes Castle and Anne of Cleves House

We will visit both Lewes Castle and Anne of Cleves House. There is also an archaeological museum attached to Castle. Anne of Cleves House is a 10 minute downhill walk through a Park. We plan for the coach to pick us up from Anne of Cleves House at the end of the day. Both these venues are small but there is plenty of interest to see and the town of Lewes is a short walk for refreshments. Members with mobility or underlying health issues



that effect mobility should be aware that the site is very hilly and the stairs to the top of the keep are steep. We intend to be in touch with Banstead coaches about accessibility to Anne of Cleves House for the coach to help with transfers between properties and on departure for home.

The coach will leave Shotfield, Wallington at 11am and Ruskin

Road, Carshalton 11:15am. The coach will leave Lewes (Anne of Cleves House) at 4:30 returning to Carshalton /Wallington about 6pm. The cost is £35 per person including the entry cost to both attractions. Leader is Phil Groves 07710 549268, booking by 4th July.

#### Wednesday 17 August 2022 — Butser Ancient Farm

Butser is situated on the South Downs, a few miles outside Portsmouth. For many years archaeologists here have experimented with ancient methods of farming, raising livestock and building houses. You can visit the results of their work, relating to the Stone Age, Bronze Age, Iron Age, Roman and Anglo-Saxon periods.

The coach will leave Shotfield, Wallington at 11.30am and Ruskin Road, Carshalton at



11.45am (note change of time from previous Newsletter). We plan to arrive at 1.30pm for a Lecture Tour at 2.00pm. Tea or coffee will be served on arrival. There should be time for light refreshments in the Visitor Centre before we leave at 4.00pm, returning home about 5.30pm to 6.00pm. We recommend that you bring a packed lunch to eat on the coach.

Confirmation of your reservations is required by 25<sup>th</sup> July. The cost is £40 to members, including the Lecture Tour and tea or coffee on arrival.

Friday 16 September 2022 -Waverley Abbey & Rural Life Living museum Farnham



The rural life living Museum tells the story of the countryside with a unique collection of about 40 relocated historic buildings on a 10 acre site with its own arboretum. Within and around the buildings there are about 40,000 artefacts/implements/machines relating to rural life. The buildings offer plenty of shelter if it rains. Across the site are many secluded seats, a picnic area and the Old Kiln Cafe offering hot & cold food.

We plan to briefly visit Waverley Abbey en route to the Museum. The coach will leave Shotfield, Wallington at 10.30am & Ruskin Road, Carshalton at 10:45 am, returning at about 5:30 pm.

5th November 2022 David Calow on the Roman Excavations at Flexford and Godstone

3rd December 2022 Mick Taylor of the Wandle Industrial Museum will talk about the Calico People of the Wandle Valley.

7th January 2023 Anne Sassin on Lidar. Lidar is a technique available to archaeologists. It uses airborne lasers to produce a 3-D map of the ground surface without any of the vegetation, such as trees. It can discover archaeological sites which would otherwise remain hidden e.g. in forests and can also highlight shallow earthworks which are very hard to see on the ground.

4th February 2023 Margaret Coombes will give a talk about The Architectural History of the Seaside.

4th March 2023 AGM and a look at activities of the Society over the past year.

1st April 2023 A talk about the history of Painshill 18th Century landscape Garden.
