### Spring Programme

### Saturday 6th April 2024 at 2:30 p.m. Smallhythe

Nathalie Cohen will present the results of the most recent season of excavation at the National Trust property Smallhythe, which lies on the Kent/Sussex border.

Over 3 weeks in August 2023 a team of over 100 volunteers working with professional archaeologists from Archaeology South East, Museum of London Archaeology and Historic England explored the Roman, Medieval and Post Medieval past of this now tiny riverside settlement. They revealed lost buildings and routeways, evidence for Medieval ship building and artefacts which will help to tell the stories of those who lived here before us.




### Saturday 11th May at 2:30 p.m. Carshalton Lavender

Paula Bailey will talk about the Carshalton Heritage Lavender Project.

Carshalton Lavender is a not-for-profit community project that manages 3 acres of lavender in Carshalton Beeches, Surrey. This area was once famous as "the lavender capital of the world", and we work to keep the heritage of local lavender alive for current and future generations. Every year we open the field to the public at our annual harvest weekend in July.

Around 1900, blue fields could be seen across Wallington, Carshalton, Waddon





In 1996, the Local Lavender Scheme was established on the site by local environmental charity BioRegional, with the London Borough of Sutton, Downview Prison and sponsorship from several sources. The Scheme aimed to restore the world-famous lavender industry of Carshalton and Mitcham.

### Tuesday 4th June, a cruise along the Wey and Arun Canal

A two hour cruise along the a restored section of the Wey and Arun Canal through the Sussex countryside going through locks, starting at Loxwood near Billingshurst. A cream tea will be served during the cruise.

The Wey and Arun Canal Trust has an information Centre at the wharf where the cruise starts, and there is a toilet.

It is expected that the coach will arrive at Loxwood just after midday leaving time for a picnic or to have lunch at the Onslow Arms Pub, beside which the cruises start, before the cruise at 2pm. ### Smallhythe Place and Sissinghurst Castle Gardens

Smallhythe Place is a small early-16th-century house, which Natalie Cohen will tell us about at our April meeting. It was home to the Victorian actress Ellen Terry from 1899 to 1928. There is also a beautiful cottage garden, and a theatre in the 16th - century thatched barn, with Ellen Terry's theatrical collection.

Sissinghurst was a working farm until the 1930s, when it was purchased by Vita Sackville-West and Harold Nicholson, who created the world-famous gardens.

The coach will leave Shotfield at 10.00am, Ruskin Road at 10.10am and The Quadrant, Sutton, at 10.20am. We plan to arrive at Smallhythe Place at 11.30am, with time for a lunch break before we leave at 1.30pm. We should arrive at Sissinghurst at 2.00pm, where we have two hours to enjoy the gardens, with a tea break before we leave at 4.30pm, returning home about 6.00pm.

### Thursday August 15th Amberley Museum

The site occupied by the Museum was formally the Amberley Chalk Pits with its quarries, kilns and associated building. The site is now a major open-air museum contains an amazing number of different attractions. It has a Southdown Bus Garage with vintage buses, a fire station, a garage, a print shop, a wood turning shop, a narrow gauge railway. There is a telephone exchange, a display of old televisions and radios, the Milne electrical collection, a pottery workshop and even a bag menders workshop. The on-site Limeburners café serves food and drinks.

You can ride in a vintage bus around the site and travel on the quarry railway.

The cost will be between £45 and £50 to include coach hire and entry to the museum.

We are unable to determine the exact cost at present as the museum is currently closed.

### Friday September 20th Ham House

Ham House is a Stuart Mansion on the Banks of the River Thames in Richmond. It was built by the Duke and Duchess of Lauderdale who transformed the house into one of the grandest of the Stuart era. The house contains a unique collection of cabinets, artworks and textiles. The 17th century garden surrounding the House has been largely restored and includes a productive kitchen garden.

There is a cafe and shop and plenty of space to picnic in the garden if you so wish.
